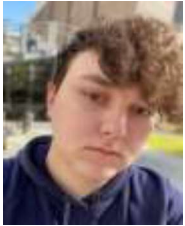

Campus Involvement: Upon joining the Atlanta Campus community I immediately sought to get involved with student organizations on campus. I joined the Alliance for Sexual and Gender Diversity eBoard in October 2021. In my first year apart of the organization I redesigned Alliance at GSU's logo, updated our social media presence and PIN page, built a discord server for LGBTQ students, and began taking a more prominent role in planning events. Starting in Fall 2022, my role expanded to managing event reservations, crafting event themes, building relationships with other organizations and departments, and managing the organization's funding. This semester after I updated our constitution, I now have 5 eBoard members that I directly manage while I continue to help with the planning of events and SAF funding. Along with my responsibilities for Alliance at GSU, I have worked at the Center for Leadership in Disability on campus since Fall of 2022. In my role, I help execute event plans by making space reservations, event pages, helping run events, managing travel expense paperwork, and generally supporting the center in the amazing work it does. In my role, I have continued to expand my capabilities and hope to further my support of disabled people, their families, and the professionals who work to better their lives. Outside of my primary roles at Alliance at GSU and CLD, I have worked with a variety of different organizations on campus. I am currently working closely with the Young Democratic Socialists of America at GSU, United Campus Workers at GSU, Metro Three Arrows, Faces of Feminism, and the Multicultural Center to help strengthen their programming and better support students. I have developed a resource toolkit for other RSOs to utilize to make it easier for student organizations to navigate GSU regulations and self-organize. I have also gotten started a joint RSO council with the goal of collaboratively addressing issues on campus. In all my work I have tried to expand student engagement and create structures for expanded student power.

Why should you be elected? Since I joined the Atlanta Campus community my focus has been to create opportunities for students to get the most out of their college experience. In the short time I've been here I believe I have accomplished quite a bit. Gaining elected office will help me expand on what I have already accomplished and make a greater impact on students.

Goals: Currently, students who work on campus, undergraduate and graduate, can earn 8 dollars or even less an hour for their work. This is unacceptable in 2023 and GSU is failing to adequately pay its workers and often doing so despite the help of federal financial aid dollars for FWS workers. When it comes to graduate students, some can be paid less per year in stipends than part-time undergraduate students receive. The school also requires graduate student workers to pay hundreds of dollars of fees per semester and requires workers to pay high premiums for healthcare. This issue of a complete lack of fair wages for students is extremely exploitative and makes GSU more inaccessible to low-income and first-generation students. To address this issue I plan to increase the pressure student organizations place on the school to raise wages for all workers at GSU including faculty. My goal is to build a coalition centered around this issue that cannot be ignored. I hope to pass legislation that furthers this plan and use the platform SGA has to push the GSU administration to act. Furthermore, I plan to work with departments to lower the fees and costs placed on student workers and allow flexibility for departments to pay students more. Finally, I hope to draw public attention to this issue and shed light on the issues student workers face.
